



Trinity Lutheran Code of Conduct for Athletes

Participation in athletics is a privilege and not a right. When an athlete behaves in a God-pleasing manner, (s)he earns the privilege to participate. Each by example touches the lives of everyone from teammates and coaches to the spectators in the stands.

I, _____ agree that by my actions I am an ambassador for Christ. My behavior will reflect this regardless of how anyone else tries to influence me. As a Christian athlete, I agree to the following:

1. I agree to come to practice and games on time, and with the proper attire. If I am unable to attend, I will ask my parent(s) to communicate by a note, phone call, or email with the athletic director or coach the reason for my absence. This communication will happen before practices and games.

I understand that my son or daughter may receive disciplinary actions for being late, being without equipment or shoes, or having an unexcused absence. (parent initials here _____)

2. I agree to the Trinity Lutheran School athletic eligibility policy as stated below.

Each student is expected to turn in homework on a daily basis.

- A. When a student is missing three assignments, (s)he and parents will be notified. The student will have until 7:30 a.m. the following school day to turn in the completed assignments, which display satisfactory effort according to the directions of the assignment given by the teacher. If the assignments are not turned in, the player will be suspended for three days of sports (practice and/or game day) thus obtaining their first offense. During a suspension, the player will not be allowed to attend any practice or games. Any day where there is no scheduled practice or game does not count as one of the suspended days.
- B. Students must complete the missing assignments in order to return to the team after the suspension. The suspension will continue beyond three days if the assignments are not turned in. Coaches reserve the right to bench eligible players for missing practice during a suspension.
- C. Lastly, if the student obtains three offenses (nine or more missing assignments), (s)he will be removed from the team roster.
